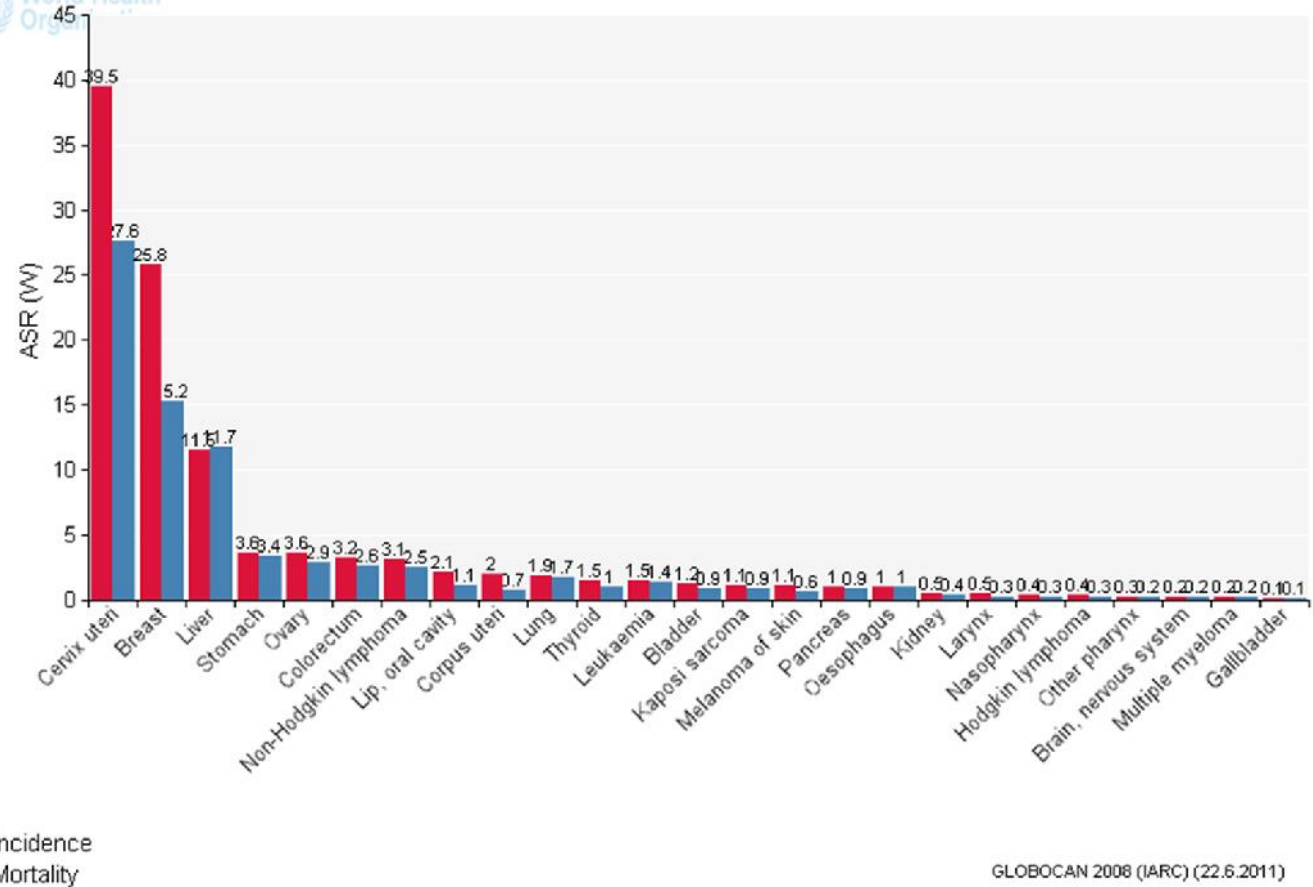

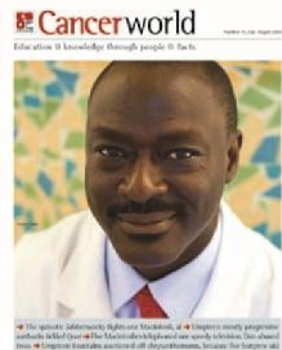

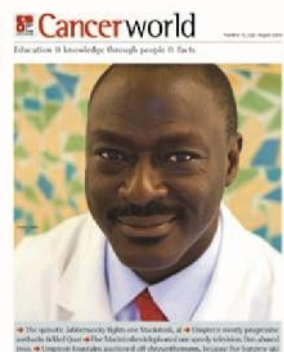
Data for both incidence and mortality are given. A big difference between the blue and the red indicates greater success in treating the cancer



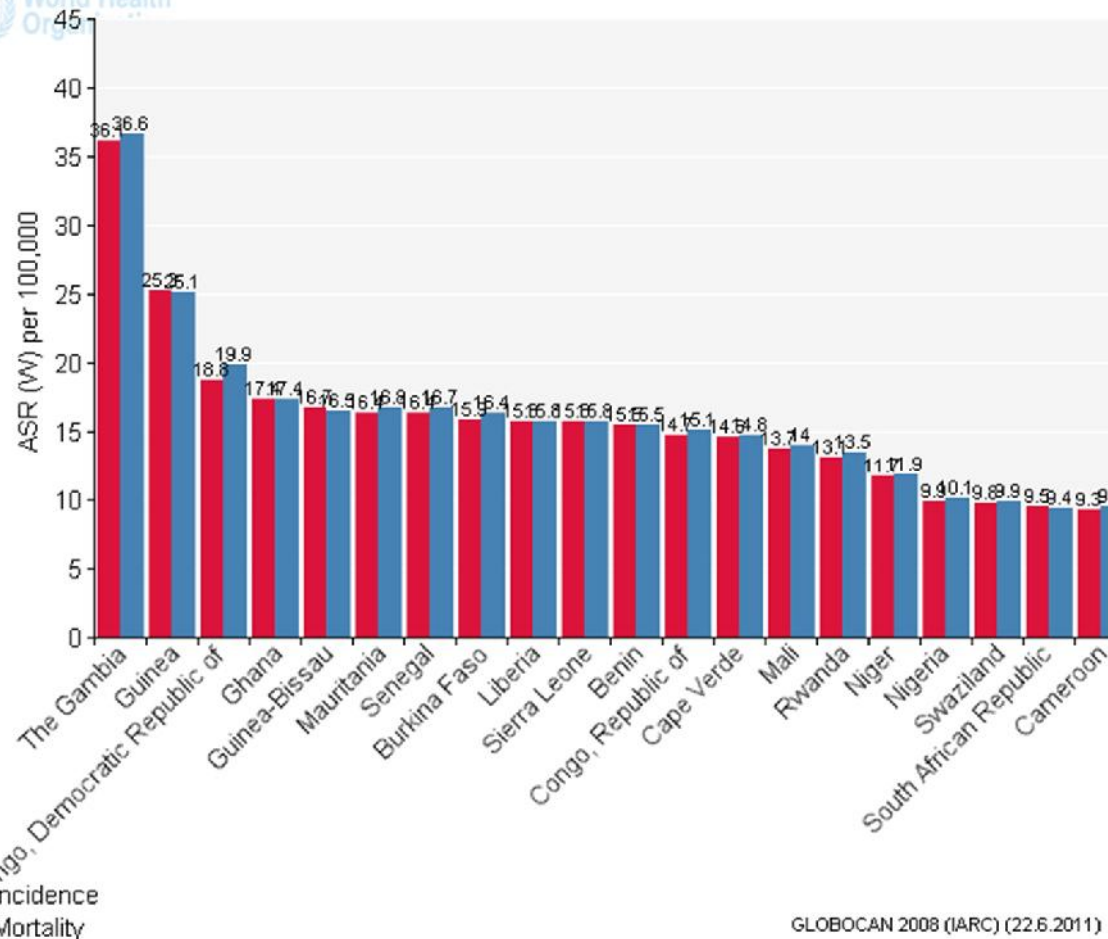
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International Agency for Research on Cancer Liver: both sexes, all ages

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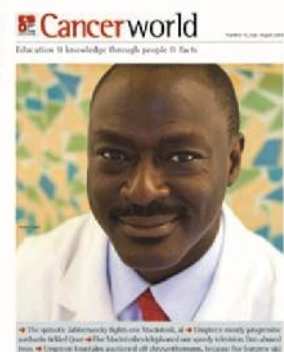
This chart indicates that liver cancer is almost always fatal – many cases are, however avoidable. A good vaccination programme would bring rates down



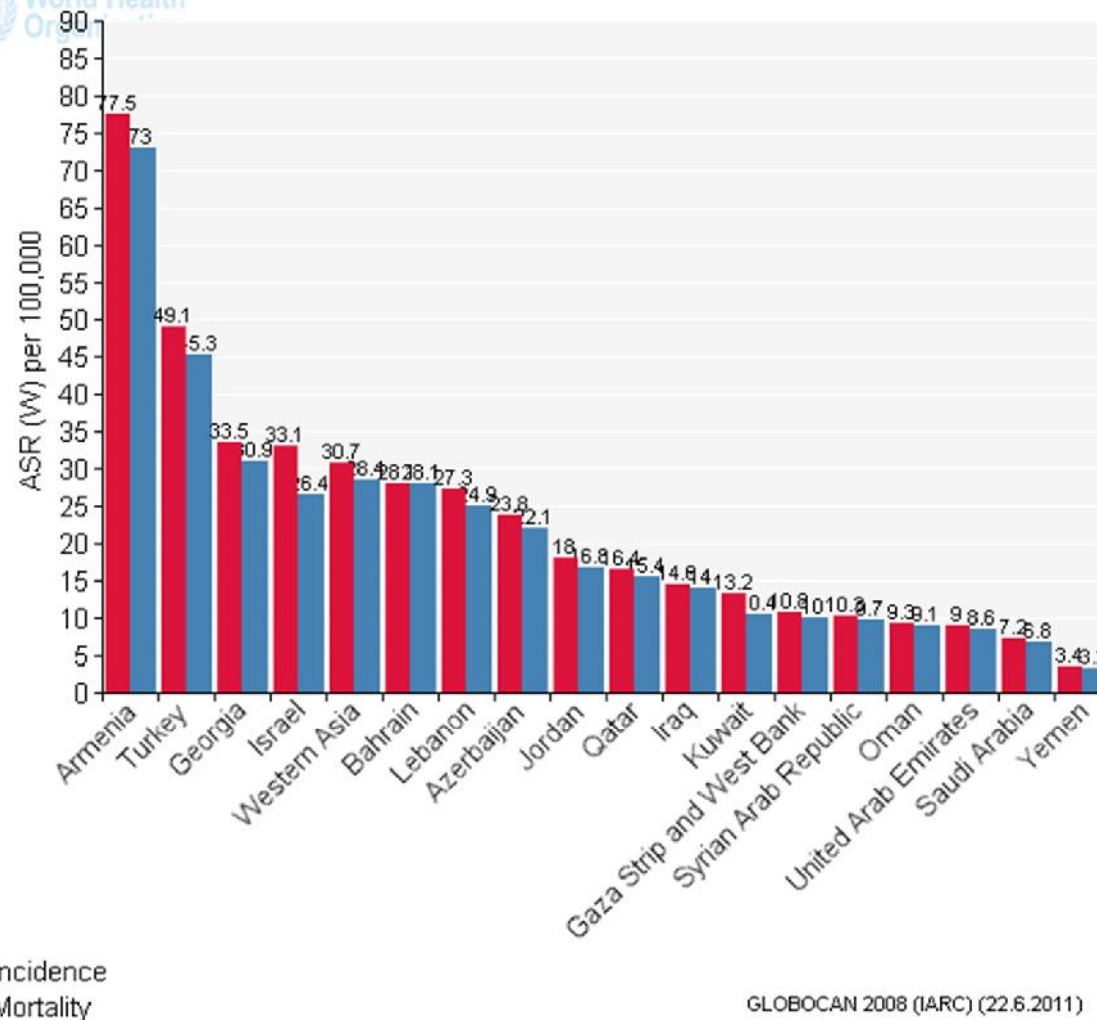
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International Agency for Research on Cancer Lung: male, all ages

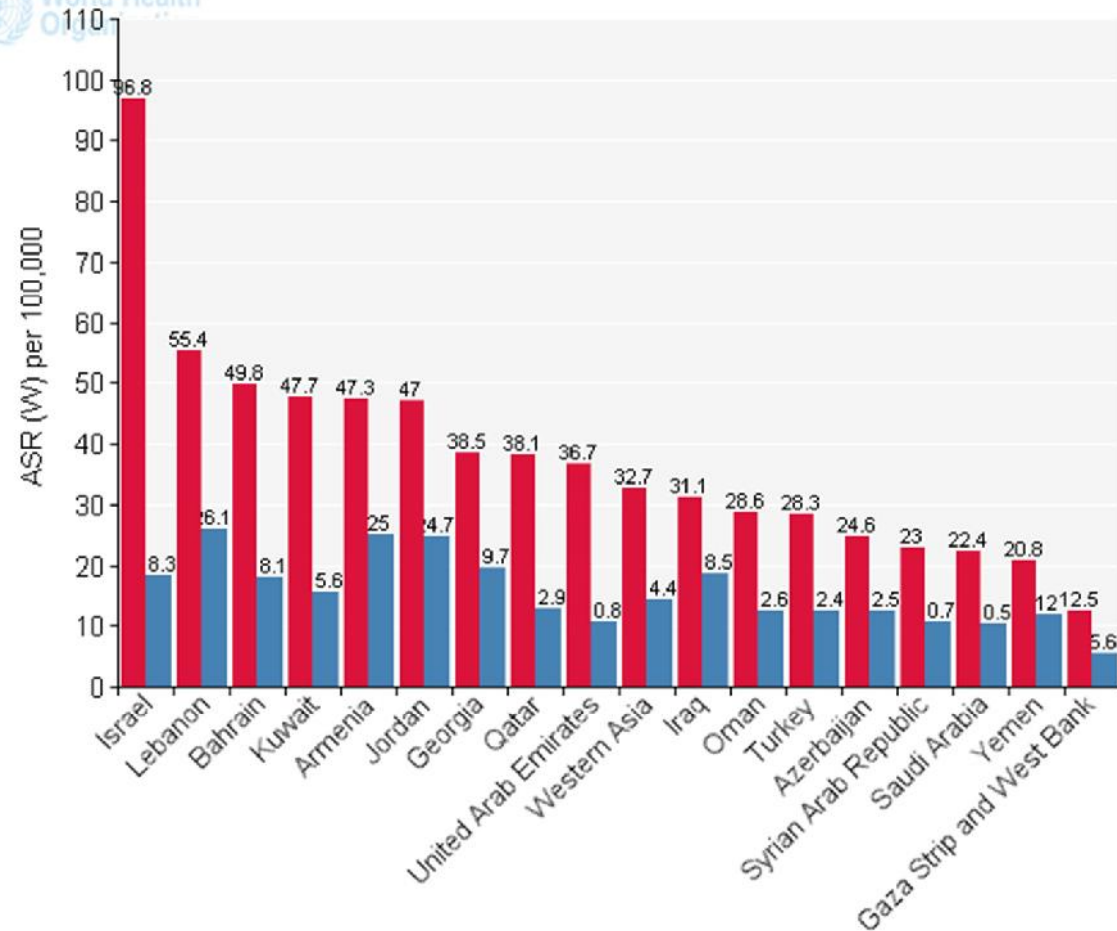
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Another cancer that is hard to treat effectively, but we know how to prevent the vast majority of cases!

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Israel has three times more cases than Iraq, but fewer deaths. Early detection is key.



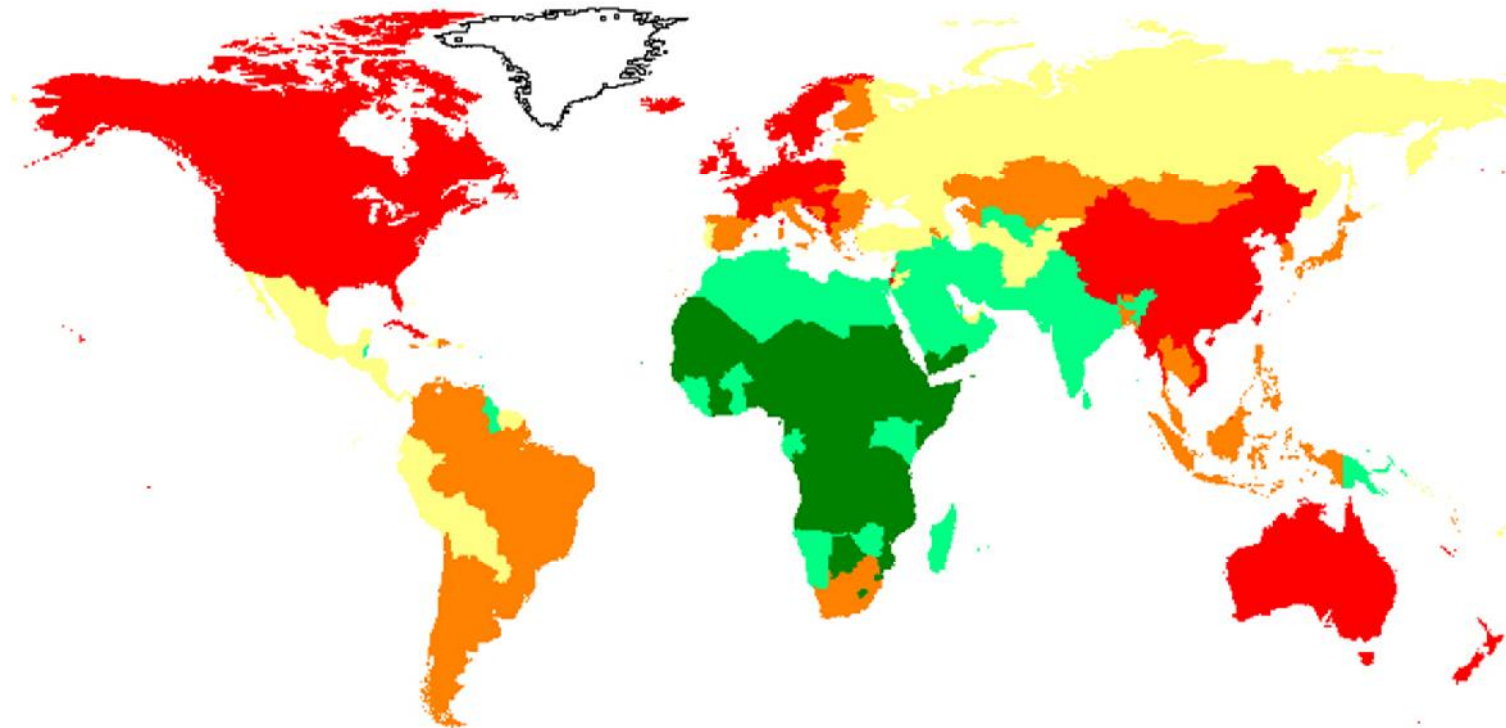
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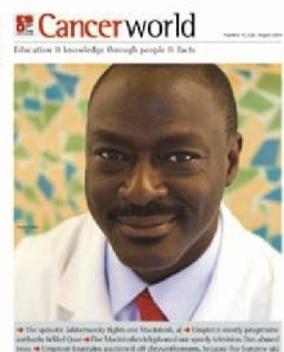

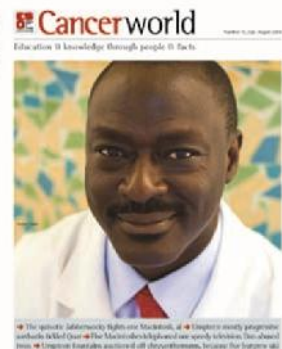

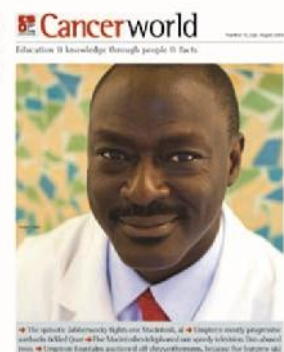
The estimate of the population-at-risk is based on the 1996 census, making allowance for births and deaths, but it was not possible to estimate migration into and out of the registration area.

- Data on 564,606 cases of different cancers ranging 1–56 sites/types from 27 registries in 14 low-/medium-resource countries in Eastern and Western Africa, the Caribbean, Central America and four regions of Asia, registered during 1990–2001 (period varying for individual registries).
